By public transport:

By train from Hamburg Central Station to train station Wilhelmsburg and then by foot:

This is just three stops and 8 minutes by commuter train (every 5 minutes) from Hamburg Central Station by line S3 (direction Neugraben or Buxtehude, both call at S-Bahn Station Wilhelmsburg) or S31 direction Harburg-Rathaus as well calling at S-Bahn Station Wilhelmsburg. The dayticket is 5,80€ if you start your journey after 9:00 am or 7,10€ if you start before 9:00 am.

Here is a map of the footwalk from the train station to the Bürgerhaus Wilhelmsburg. It is 800m and takes about 10 minutes.

While you walk there you will see on your right side the brand new office building of the Hamburg Ministry for Urban Development and Environment and on your left side the best practice energy efficient and sustainable buildings of the International Building Exhibition IBA and the entrance to the International Garden Exhibition which both took place in Hamburg this year:
